Stay Well this Winter

This annual NHS campaign aims to help you protect your health, and that of those for whom you care. Winter conditions can be seriously bad for our health, especially for people aged 65 or over, and people with long-term conditions. I've attached a copy of the essential advice from the NHS Choices website.

Leading on from this, **Self Care Week** is on 16-22 November. The aim is to help people take care of themselves and let them know what's available to help them look after their health. Find out more from the Self Care Forum or NHS Choices.

New National Vision & Strategy for Nurses, Midwives & Care Staff

The national nursing team are hosting an initial informal discussion with groups of patients and public in each region from which they will prepare a 'new vision' for further full consultation between now and next March. A copy of the invitation is attached.

GPs and Hospital Referrals

Over the last week or so there has been quite a bit of attention in the media to reports that GPs are "wasting" significant amounts of time re-referring patients to hospitals for outpatient appointments, and what the government is proposing to do about it. Here are two reports:

- From GP Online: GPs demand end to 'scandalous' waste of 14m appointments from repeat hospital referrals
- From BBC News: Jeremy Hunt acts on 'time-wasting' referrals

Local Health Service Ratings

The Health Secretary is also proposing new 'Ofsted style' ratings to show patients how their local health service is performing in crucial areas, including cancer, dementia, diabetes, mental health, learning disabilities, maternity care. Patients' View of 7-Day GP Services

Also in the last week or so there has been a report in the *Guardian* that an evaluation for NHS England has shown that patients are reluctant to attend GP surgeries on Saturday afternoons and Sundays, leading some practices to have already withdrawn the service. 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So what does the NHS Spend its Money on?

The NHS is the world's fifth biggest employer and spends over £2billion a week. But what is it spent on? A recent *Daily Telegraph* investigation has highlighted some of the things the money goes on – everything from gardening and loo roll to knee replacements and end of life care. Perhaps more surprising is how some areas are getting hugely better value for money than others. No wonder the government are mounting a productivity review. Full report at
