NHS Structures are Complex and Confused

This is the conclusion reached in a review by former Health Secretary Alan Milburn for consultants PwC. According to a BBC News item (http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health-37846112):

The PwC report was critical of the changes introduced in 2012 by then Health Secretary Andrew Lansley, which have resulted in the creation of "myriad" national organisations, including:

§ NHS England

§ NHS Improvement

§ Health Education England

§ Public Health England

...

The review said many of the functions of these competing organisations could be gradually merged.

Healthwatch Ealing

And finally a word about our local Healthwatch. As some of you will know, local councils are required, by law, to establish and fund a local Healthwatch group. Ealing Council put the contract to run Healthwatch Ealing out to tender some while back and it now looks as if the present provider has lost the contract to an organisation called Your Voice in Health and Social Care (YVHSC) who I believe also run Healthwatch Hounslow and Healthwatch Tower Hamlets. However the decision has yet to be ratified by the council. If agreed YHSC will take over on 1 April 2017. More when I know more.
