Coronavirus

There's a lot of talk at present about the Covid-19 vaccines. I'm not going into any of the details here apart from to say that for anyone interested in some overview and a look at the logistics I've written a number of posts on my blog, https://zenmischief.com/, over the last month.

Vaccine Roll-out Priorities

The *Guardian* yesterday (Saturday 26/11) ran an article outlining updated thinking on the order in which various groups are offered Covid-19 vaccination. The highest priorities seem to be: (1) older adults in care homes and care home workers; (2) those 80 and over and health and social care workers; (3) those 75 years and over; (4) those 70 and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals; others then follow. Also early in the month GPs were told to be ready to start adminietring Covid-19 vaccinations before Christmas, and this seems to be regularly re-emphasised, as the availability of at least one vaccine in the next 2-3 weeks is being hyped up. General NHS News

Vaccination Importance

There's an NHS article at https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/why-vaccination-is-safe-and-important/ on the importance and safety of vaccination in general. The important message is:

Vaccination is the most important thing we can do to protect ourselves and our children against ill health. They prevent up to 3 million deaths worldwide every year. Since vaccines were introduced in the UK, diseases like smallpox, polio and tetanus that used to kill or disable millions of people are either gone or seen very rarely. Other diseases like measles and diphtheria have been reduced by up to 99.9% since their vaccines were introduced.

Or to quote Prof. Alice Roberts:

The two greatest defences against infectious diseases are:

- 1. Clean water
- 2. Vaccines the single most life-saving medical innovation in the history of medicine

Blood Test for Cancers

Early detection of cancer dramatically improves outcomes and life expectancy. Starting next year the NHS is therefore going to trial a blood test which is said to be able to detect over 50 different cancers often years before symptoms become apparent. Note that this is a trial, with a large but limited number of participants; if the results in 2023 show the test works, there will be a larger trial in 2024 and 2025.
