He is considering possible rebranding the PPG to make it more meaningful to patients.     </li> <li>Sennen talked about how treatment for prostate cancer was a postcode lottery as different areas have different rules for drugs which may be prescribed and operations which may be performed.         It appears that no-one over 75 is offered prostate cancer surgery, although this is not documented.     </li> <li>Drugs which may be prescribed are defined in the local Formulary, which restricts what NICE permits.         Ours is the NW London Formulary. Discussion of the pressures on GPs and the effect it's having on access to doctors.  Harsha has received reports of people still encountering long waits in the phone queue, only to be cut off when they get to number 1 in the queue. Keith to raise with Matt. Action: Keith 13/12/2021. Raised with Matt who investigated, but cannot reproduce the problem.  More generally people are still complaining about 40+ minute waits on the phone – forgetting that in the past they would have spent an hour calling and getting an engaged tone.  Matt reported earlier in the year the Practice was handing 10,000 calls a week (up from 4,000) and with each taking an average of 6 minutes that's an untenable workload. That's approx. 20 man days/week just to cover the phones!  The best way to access the Practice is using eConsult, although the form is rather long-winded (though we understand why).  Face-to-face consultation is always available if required. Phone consultation works well for us.  Praise for Dr Fong, her thoroughness and dedication, from Harsha.  Why do reception ask personal questions? So they can direct you to the right person, with the right urgency.
