
Welcome to the October update for Barnabas Patient Voices members.

Surprisingly this month I've not registered any significant updates from either the Practice or the local area beyond what's in the meeting minutes (see below). If anyone picks up healthcare news then please drop me an email (or note) so if appropriate I can include it here.

Coronavirus

Yes, I'm sorry everyone, but Covid isn't going away – in fact looking at the <u>Zoe Study data</u> estimated infection rates are still increasing at a steady rate with around 1 in 50 people currently infected and almost 100,000 new infections daily. OK that's still below the peaks of a year ago, but it isn't good. The increase seems to be due to the new BA.2.86 variant (aka. Pirola) as we seem to have forgotten many of the previous lessons learnt.

As a consequence everyone would be wise to continue following the "Swiss cheese model" (below; it's not Covid specific) of infection control and use as many mitigating actions as possible – many are down to the government to implement or facilitate, so you can't do them all, but any is better than none!



Covid-19 booster vaccinations and annual 'flu vaccination are now available for those eligible. Details for <u>Covid</u> and 'flu.

On the back of this UKHS and ONS are launching a new <u>Covid-19 infection study</u> from next month. As it will rely on lateral flow testing it won't be as robust as the previous ONS study (using PCR tests, which take longer and cost more), but it is better than the nothing we currently have. There is also going to be a <u>new Covid & flu dashboard</u>, which could be extended to cover other respiratory infections. It's not yet clear how these two are going to join up.
